NOTES FROM THE COMPOSER

"Fly, Fly, Fly" uses the poem, *Fly Away, Fly Away Over the Sea*, written by Christina Rossetti (1830-1894) and is an original piece written for two-part treble choir and piano. Featuring the use of mode mixture, the opening chords and vocal melody of "Fly, Fly, Fly" were the first elements of this piece to develop. You'll hear modern harmonic progressions, syncopated melodies and a driving piano accompaniment that depict the journey of a bird signaling the end of the season of summer.
